

## BIOGRAPHY OF KATHRYN LIVINGSTON

Kathryn Livingston is a writer, editor and creative consultant on documentary films. She is the author of several books: *Bedlinens* (Knopf), *Eclectic Interiors: Room by Room* (Rockport), *Victorian Interiors: Room by Room* (Rockport), a biography *Yesterday is Gone* (Nicolai Verlag), and *In the Spirit of Aspen* (Assouline). Her articles on personalities, lifestyle, food, health, architecture and travel have appeared in such magazines as *Condé Nast Traveler*, *Gourmet*, *Town & Country*, *connoisseur*, *Travel & Leisure* and *House & Garden*. She served as Executive Producer on *The Hungarian Spark in America*, a film shown at the Kennedy Center. She was co-producer of a biographical film on Dr. Tom Dooley, the American jungle doctor working with refugees and orphans during the Indochinese wars in Southeast Asia.

She had a twenty-year editorial career with Hearst Magazines, starting out as a fashion writer at *Harper's Bazaar*, and for ten years serving as Executive Editor of *Town & country*. Two separate stints at another major media organization followed. At *Time, Inc.*, she was in charge of developing new magazines such as *Quality* and *Leisure*. And then again after the media merger of Time Warner, she was part of the company's development team for 140 television segments on Women's Health issues for a weekly program titled *Your Mind & Body*, which was shown on DBS Television.

In between, she was Editor-In-Chief of two anniversary publications, each celebrating the corporate image and community involvement of first, Tiffany & Co. in New York, and then of Neiman Marcus in Dallas.

She was the recipient of the Penney-Missouri Award for Excellence in Magazine Journalism, and also garnered awards from the Art Directors Club of New York, Nina Ricci Perfumes and the Public Affairs Department of New York University.
